ABOUT YOUNG AUSTRALIANS IN INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Young Australians in International Affairs (YAIA) is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to connecting and engaging the next generation of Australian leaders in international affairs and to building the high calibre leaders necessary to navigate Australia's future in the Indo-Pacific century. YAIA is a company limited by guarantee and a registered charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profit Commission (ACNC).

ABOUT THE ROLE

The Chief Financial Officer is responsible for managing the organisation's financial transactions, including by preparing financial statements and reviewing financial records according to relevant standards. As a Director of YAIA and key member of the leadership team, the CFO will work closely with the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Operations Officers to ensure YAIA meets its financial requirements consistent with its status as a registered not-for-profit company and charity limited by guarantee. This position will also manage a Finance Officer. The successful candidate will ideally have qualifications in accounting or finance, for example, CA or CPA membership. The CFO will be a confident leader who is passionate about building opportunities for students and young professionals in international affairs.
